# Dreams of (Human) Machines

This seminar examines the role of machines and automatons in regard to the modernist crisis of representation, the fantasy of artificial procreation, and the connection between art and life. Beginning with a discussion of E. T. A. Hoffmann's horror story "The Sandman" and several key passages of Mary Shelley's *Frankenstein*, we will investigate the ways in which dreams of human machines are linked to ways to overcome a loss; we will then look at the ways in which 19<sup>th</sup> century hysterics and their doctors influenced each other; try to make sense of Dada sound poems and the Surrealist concept of "automatic writing," read Franz Kafka's story "In the Penal Colony," travel to the Philadelphia Museum of Art to see Marcel Duchamp's famous installation *The Bride Stripped Bare by Her Bachelors, Even (The Large Glass)*, and view science fiction films such as Fritz Lang's *Metropolis* and Ridley Scott's *Blade Runner*.
