Ecstasies of Time

Course Description:

The course will focus primarily on Heidegger's account of "ecstatic temporality" in *Being and Time* but also involve considerations of Aristotle on "suddenness," Augustine on "rapture," Hölderlin on "velocity" or *Rapidität* in Greek tragedy, and Freud, Laplanche and Derrida on belatedness or *Nachträglichkeit*. The seminar will be offered in conjunction with a four-part lecture/seminar series by David Farrell Krell, and is designed to provide students the opportunity to prepare extensively for these visits and to follow up afterward. **Readings in English and German; discussions in English.**
